

Why it Matters



Access to sport

According to UNHCR, only 10% of refugee women and girls in camps participate in structured sports programs. We want all women and girls to have access to sport. ***We want all women and girls to have access to sport.***



Access to safe spaces

Globally, fewer than 40% of women are perceived to be free from GBV, with over half of experts indicating that "almost no women" or only "some women" are free from such violence. ***We want to create safe spaces for women.***



Access to leadership opportunities

Globally, women hold only 6.7% of board chair positions and 5% of CEO roles, indicating substantial underrepresentation at the highest decision-making levels. We want to empower the next generation of young leaders. ***We want to empower the next generation of young leaders.***

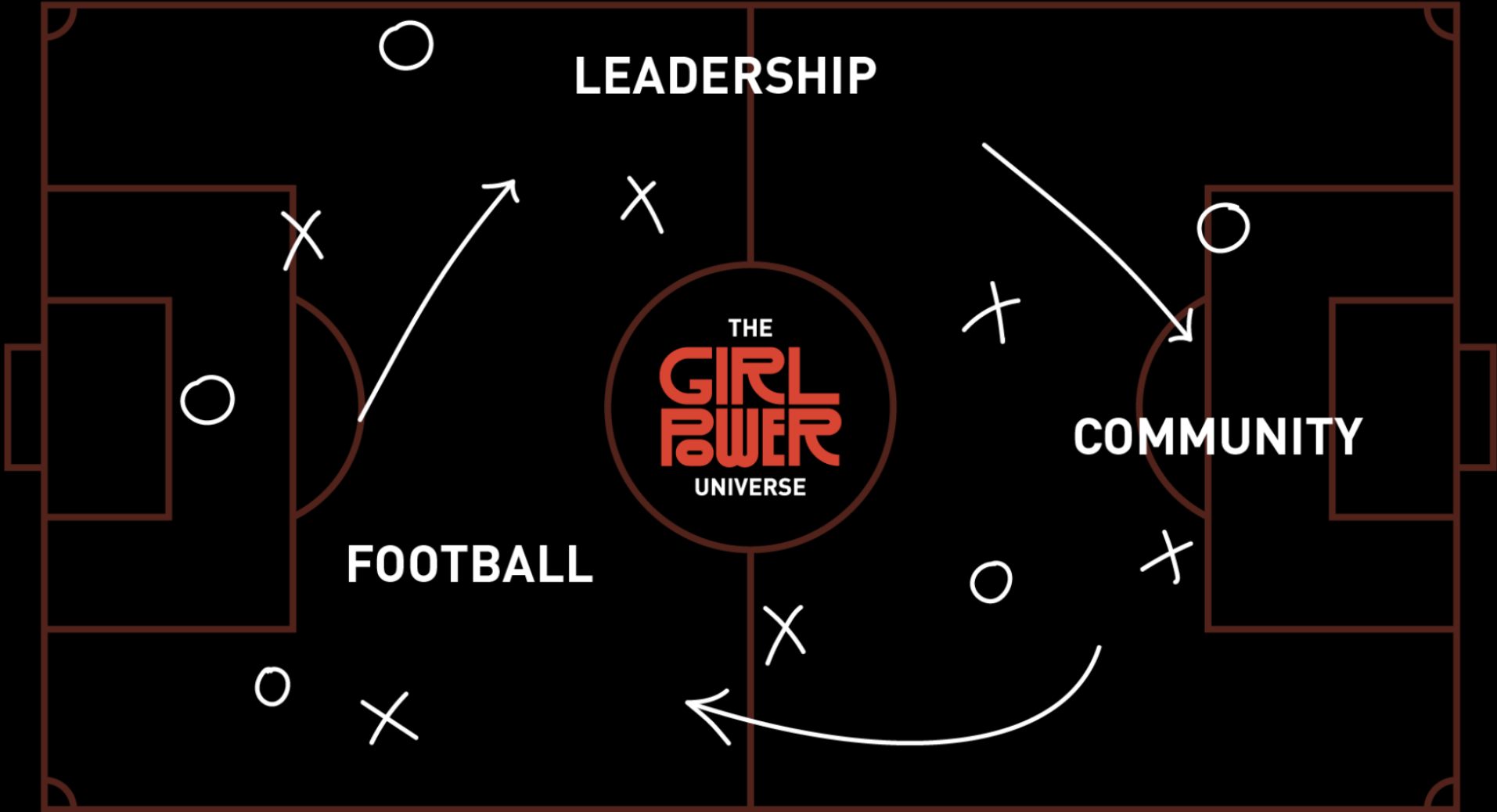
